Big Question: What's the Bible got to do with me?


Key Words: SCRIPTURE, CANON, INTERPRETATION, TRANSLATION

BIBLE CONNECTION

-] The Bible is inspired by God and written by people.
- 1 The Bible includes the Old and New Testaments.
-] Biblical authors had different reasons for writing their books.
- John says that what he wrote is testimony (John 21:24).
- Luke wrote so we may know the truth (Luke 1:4).
- 1 Paul wrote that scripture is given for instruction and encouragement (Romans 15:4).
- **]** Second Timothy 3:16-17 gives us lots of different uses for scripture.
- 1 It's best not to take the entire Bible literally.
-] When people talk about the Bible, make sure it reveals the God of love!
