A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JON RHODES



Easter Sunday was unexpectedly different this year. Perhaps you noticed, after weeks of leading worship from home I was in the Christiania sanctuary. I know it was comforting to be there and, based on your comments and texts, you were comforted by the sight of our stripped altar followed by your pastor and the altar both outfitted in full, golden Easter regalia. Someone even brought Easter flowers.

Friends, Christ and Christ's church are both alive and well. When people and a community exhibit great vitality and connectedness—Christ and Christ's church are alive. When we exhibit patience and endurance in learning new things-Christ and Christ's church are alive. When we exhibit important Godly relational commitments like trust, forgiveness, empathy, compassion, and grace-Christ and Christ's church are alive.

If you were to step into Christiania's building today you would find it strangely empty and lacking in life. But if you were to connect with Christiania's people you would find us full of life. The church is like Christ's tomb on Easter Sunday— empty; not because of death but because of life.

The Gospel of Matthew tells the same story after Jesus' death: But the angel said to the women. "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go guickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. Suddenly Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshiped him. Then Jesus said to them. "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me. (Matthew 28:5-10)

The message of the Cross is this: Jesus' crucifixion led to death which was overcome by resurrection life. Our traditional Easter liturgy includes the proclamation, "Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!" Let us continue to proclaim Easter resurrection and also make a similar proclamation during this time of Covid-19 and Shelter in Place Orders: "The Church is risen! She is risen, indeed! Alleluia!" I see so many ways you/we are connecting and being church in the world, in the intentionality of sending cards and letters, in making phone calls and sending check-in texts, and in creativity (i.e. car caravans, pictures, and signs.)

Although we cannot, yet, be together physically—we are still very much connected. Keep it up. This time has also brought a return to our ancient ways of connecting as church: prayer and meditation, worship, scripture, and service. During Lent we listened to each other sharing our faith stories and witnessing. Let us continue to be witnesses to Christ's resurrection. Together, let us witness and proclaim as if it is true: Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!

A MESSAGE FROM ROB METZ - COUNCIL PRESIDENT

The Christiania Executive Council met on April 14, 2020. We devoted most of our discussion to reviewing and discussing the church's response to the Coronavirus pandemic. This included a long discussion regarding the option to apply for a Payroll Protection Plan (PPP) forgivable loan. The Council eventually decided to move ahead with the loan application process but also determined that if acquired, the funds could not be accepted unless the congregation approved. A special congregational meeting has been scheduled for Sunday, May 3 at 11:30 a.m. for this purpose.

Here's how the Red Cross is keeping donors safe:

The top priority of the Red Cross is the safety of our donors, volunteers, employees and blood recipients, and we are committed to transparency with the American public during this evolving public health emergency. There are no data or evidence that this coronavirus can be transmissible by blood transfusion, and there have been no reported cases worldwide of transmissions for any respiratory virus including this coronavirus.

Donating blood products is essential to community health and eligible donors are strongly urged to donate blood, platelets, or AB Elite plasma. The Red Cross only collects blood from individuals who are healthy and feeling well at the time of donation – and who meet other eligibility requirements.

At each blood drive or donation center, Red Cross employees follow thorough safety protocols, includina:

- Wearing gloves and changing them often
- Wiping down donor-touched areas after every collection
- Using sterile collection sets for every donation
- Preparing the arm for donation with aseptic scrub
- Conducting donor mini-physicals to ensure donors are healthy and well on day of donation
