#### A WORD FROM SENIOR PASTOR JON RHODES

In summer we often enjoy a slower pace. This can make it a wonderful time for greater worship intention. This summer we have two weekly opportunities for worship. Together, we'll worship in the midweek (Wednesdays 6:30 pm) and on the weekend (Sundays 9:00 am). All summer worship will be both in-person and streamed live online.

Last Wednesday's midweek worship was a real joy as we welcomed more than 50 people, including many VBS participants and their families. Our Bible focus was Psalm 100:1-5, a Psalm of thanksgiving, which encourages us to "make a joyful noise."

Psalm 100 All Lands Summoned to Praise God; A Psalm of thanksgiving.

Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth.

Worship the Lord with gladness; come into his presence with singing.

Know that the Lord is God.

It is he that made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.

Enter his gates with thanksgiving,

and his courts with praise. Give thanks to him, bless his name.

For the Lord is good;

his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations.

Together in worship we considered our favorite joyful noises: singing; kids voices; crying from happiness; laughter; and the first cries of a newborn baby. Joyful noise is how life looks when we're fully engaged, safe living with passion, and trusting in God. Joyful noise describes a Godly way of living—really living engaged, connected, alive, and free. Joyful noise is attentive to living, passion, engagement, and connection. Our VBS participant's can encourage us toward living in deeply engaged ways.

Here are a couple joyful noise questions for consideration:

- Where, in your life, are you most joyful/engaged/passionate/alive?
- Where are you least joyful/engaged/passionate/alive?

Friends, the psalmist encourages all of us to make a joyful noise. Pay attention to both the places that we are most engaged and alive as well as the places we are least engaged and alive. Psalm 100 reminds us that "the Lord is good." God is dependable and truly endures forever. Remember how blessed we are. Join me in expressing and sharing our thanksgivings. Enjoy the opportunities for summer ministry. Make a joyful noise!



#### SANCTUARY REFRESH

Re-what?

You may have noticed the drop box at the entrance of the sanctuary asking "What do you think?" Perhaps you heard Cheryl Mohn talk about who we are and why we have formed this committee or maybe you even filled out your comments already or talked to us face to face. You may have even seen a link on the church website, <a href="www.christianialutheranchurch.org">www.christianialutheranchurch.org</a>, asking for your input. Well, these are all signs that the Refresh/Revitalize/Rejuvenate committee has 're-started' their meetings to address the physical state of the church building.

As we all age, we have things that we need to take care of for safety. It might mean using a cane or having an alarm to take our pills. It may mean we have a wheelchair and need certain space parameters and ramp access. It may mean we need to get our eyes checked more regularly to address any up-and-coming issues or it might mean we have holes in our favorite pair of shoes and it is time to get something that will cover our feet comfortably and give us a little more 'spring' in our step. Well, it's pretty much the same for our church building.

Our church building has been hard at work since 1960, and it is starting to feel the years of housing an active congregation. Never fear—your Refresh/Revitalize/Rejuvenate committee has compiled a list of items for consideration and divided them into categories of: Safety, ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act), Maintenance and Refresh. Our goal is to enhance the interior of the sanctuary to achieve a healthy, safe, stable, functional space for the 21<sup>st</sup> century that is ADA compliant and aesthetically pleasing for the whole congregation Hmm…that's a lot….

This list is the starting point for the project. We want your feedback. How? (see the first paragraph)

#### <u>Safety</u>

- Pews some supports are cracked and the wood is becoming brittle
- Divider curtains are very had to pull and are showing signs of wear and tare
- Carpet on the altar is rippled and a trip hazard

#### **ADA- Americans with Disabilities Act**

- Altar- provide a ramp for access
- Pews- make a space for wheelchairs and walkers in sanctuary seating
- Access to sanctuary for seating
- Bathrooms

#### Maintenance

- Electric panel upgrade possibly needed to accommodate technology, music and lighting in sanctuary
- Windows are original both sanctuary and education wing could be upgraded
- A/C is at the end of its life replace it and maybe move it to south side of roof
- Insulate the peaked roof and replace shingles—slightly damaged in previous storms

#### Refresh

- Cleaning and possibly re-varnishing wood ceiling
- Replace the "tile" floor under pews
- Soffit updates
- Lighting
- Stained glass inserts re-purposed?
- Altar Wall

- Moving the altar and giving it a new façade
- Kneeling rail options
- Paneling repairs
- Painting
- Band area re-imagined

The above is what we have noted in our meetings and from your comments. Feel free to reach out to us with further comments.

#### UPDATE FROM THE COVID RESPONSE TEAM

The team last met on June 21. Here is a summary of the latest developments and recommendations:

- Coffee hour: This has returned on Sunday mornings after the worship service. It is now being offered indoors. It is good to see everyone getting back together! The Congregational Life ministry team will continue to make adjustments and additions as appropriate.
- Funerals: Christiania recently hosted it's first public memorial service since the pandemic began. There were 193 people in worship and many more who attended the visitation. Food was brought in by the family during the visitation. The team recommended that the Funeral Committee begin planning for ways to provide food for future funerals.
- VBS: 38 student participants attended the first day, supported by 12 youth mentors and several adult volunteers. In keeping with local school policies, and consistent with CDC recommendations, unvaccinated staff, volunteers, and students are not required to wear masks while outside, but are strongly encouraged to wear face coverings when inside. This is to support children under the age of 12 who are not yet eligible for vaccination.
- Medical Team update: about 45 percent are fully vaccinated in the U.S.
- ♦ Reopening Next Steps:
  - Recommend moving away from the pre-packaged communion elements in favor of the traditional wafers and individual cups administered at the front of the sanctuary. Barring any challenges this change will take effect for the July 18 worship service.
  - \* Hymnals and Bibles may be returned to the pews. Make sure the hand sanitizer is also put with them.
  - \* As of July 1, office hours are back to 9 am-5 pm. Each of the staff will be setting more regular office hours.
  - Working on a plan for reopening the Nursery. This includes developing updated procedures for sanitizing and storing toys - before and after cleaning.

The COVID-19 reopening team medical professionals and educators will continue to monitor guidance and may renew mask or social distancing requirements should the need arise.
