SENIOR PASTOR JON RHODES

The good news of Jesus Christ—the Message!—begins here, following to the letter the scroll of the prophet Isaiah.

Watch closely: I'm sending my preacher ahead of you; He'll make the road smooth for you. Thunder in the desert! Prepare for God's arrival! Make the road smooth and straight! (Mark 1:1-3 The Message)

Thanksgiving is a good time for turkey, pumpkin pie, and family. It's also a good time for giving thanks for the many blessings our benevolent God has provided. Thank you, God. In the days after Thanksgiving, you may also find yourself giving thanks for the blessings of a new season, Advent. Advent is many things: the beginning of something new; the beginning of the church liturgical year; and a time of preparation and waiting for the coming of Emmanuel—God with us.

One of the resources we use in preparation for worship each week, "Sundays and Seasons," shares this helpful overview regarding Advent: "Although the historical record is sketchy, it appears that our Advent arose out of a season of fasting to prepare for baptisms at Epiphany. By the sixth century, an eschatological emphasis was present. Our Advent comprises the four Sundays before Christmas. Each year, the first Sunday deals with our readiness for divine judgment, the second Sunday the ministry of John the Baptist, the third Sunday the Baptist's call to a repentant life, and only on the fourth Sunday a narrative concerning the birth of Jesus. God comes, in the past in the history of Israel and the incarnation of Jesus, in the present in the word and sacrament of each Sunday and in the sufferings of our time, and in the future at the end of all things. The lectionary appoints readings to fit this pattern, and its tone stands in stark contrast to our society's weeks of preparation for Christmas. Liturgical advice to keep a meaningful Advent without a December-long celebration of Christmas is meant not to be a kill-joy, but to awake our longing for the surprising ways that God comes to us. We mean to be a people who know what time it is and are willing to wait for what will come—a people who do not sing Easter hymns during Lent nor Christmas hymns in Advent."

I like that line: "to awake our longing for the surprising ways that God comes to us." God does, indeed, come to us in surprising ways. Unfortunately, the month of December is so full and busy with all kinds of good things that it can be challenging to notice the signs and ways God comes to us. It can be even tough to pause and wait. As we wait in hope during Advent, it's such a necessary time to pause. Advent's waiting leaves space and time for the spiritual: quiet reflection, prayer, meditation, serving others, and dwelling in the word. What are your practices during this time? Are they all centered in preparing for Christmas? Or do they include making space for the arrival of the Messiah, Jesus?

The Gospel of Matthew (2:1-4) from *The Message* reminds us to make time to pay attention to the signs of Emmanuel, God with us: *After Jesus was born in Bethlehem village, Judah territory—this was during Herod's kingship—a band of scholars arrived in Jerusalem from the East. They asked around, "Where can we find and pay homage to the newborn King of the Jews? We observed a star in the eastern sky that signaled his birth. We're on pilgrimage to worship him." When word of their inquiry got to Herod, he was terrified—and not Herod alone, but most of Jerusalem as well. Herod lost no time. He gathered all the high priests and religion scholars in the city together and asked, "Where is the Messiah supposed to be born?"*

"Where is the Messiah supposed to be born?" indeed. I pray that Jesus isn't an afterthought or just an idea. I pray that this season would provide surprising ways God is present.

Make Jesus is the reason for the season!

A Message from the Worship Committee

Greetings Christiania! I am writing on behalf of the Worship Committee in response to recent questions about the appropriateness of applause during worship services, especially following music. After doing our homework by reading many arguments for both sides, we have come to the conclusion that thoughtful applause is welcome at Christiania. We recognize that our congregation is warm and encouraging, and that applause is sometimes the only response we are accustomed to for showing immediate thankfulness. Is applause always appropriate? Have you ever heard anyone applaud a sensitive choral anthem of "Were You There" on Good Friday? Our musicians are not making joyful noises for personal esteem, but as a prayer unto the Lord. While some of the musical prayers might be exciting and invoke an "Amen" through applause, others are more introspective with quiet endings that encourage quiet contemplation afterward. If you find such quiet music particularly moving, we encourage you to share your thankfulness with the musicians after the service. Please use your best judgement.



Merry Christmas everyone! We started the season of Advent on November 28th. This leads us on the journey to the birth of Jesus on Christmas Day. Christmas is a time when we give and receive gifts as part of the Christmas celebration. I want to take this time to thank all of the

members of Christiania for your financial giving and volunteering that you have done year in and year out. Your giving turns into receiving with a place to worship, learning the teaching of Jesus, and celebrating baptisms, weddings and funerals. Christiania staff provides us with the support to grow our Christian faith.

With this giving and receiving comes the need for us, as a congregation, to give a "cost of doing business increase" in your giving of about 10% or more this December and in the future for 2022. A goal started in October at the State of the Church Address was to cover all the general expenses in the last quarter of the year. Maybe this could be a December to remember with meeting a \$10,000/week goal of weekly giving!

The refresh committee is getting closer to showing the congregation some renderings for the sanctuary. The committee has been giving Josh and Stephanie some suggestions as they have come up with various designs. We are addressing a new look for walls, ceiling, flooring, and the front wall. Other things in the designs are ADA access to the altar and ADA seating and updated lighting. Look for more announcements soon as the ideas will soon be available!

Items covered in our November council meeting:

- *Send out a statement of giving year to date in early December
- *Outsource our payroll to Paychex for a more efficient and better accounting
- *The nursery refresh is underway with fresh paint on the ceiling and walls and cleaned carpet. A new monitor will be installed for live streaming the service and wall décor will soon be hung
- *The new HVAC should be operational early December

In this month of December the council will be working on the 2022 budget. The personnel committee will be finishing staff reviews and discussing salary for staff. Stewardship will be sending out a mailing. The nominating committee will be looking for candidates for elected positions. This committee would so much appreciate knowing if you or someone you know would like to be part of a leadership role at church. "Walk ups are always welcome"!

May this Christmas season bring you hope in the future. Use your church as a place for comfort, fellowship and know that God loves you where ever you are in life's journey. Plan to attend the Christmas services that Christiania offers. Merry Christmas.


